The Bluejays lost their remaining three games to Wabeno, Eagle River, and Crandon in that order. In the Eagle River game (Homecoming), Three Lakes had the ball on the Eagle River four yard line with thirty seconds left in the game. They had two tries for a TD, but the Eagle River line held and the game ended 19-12 in their favor.

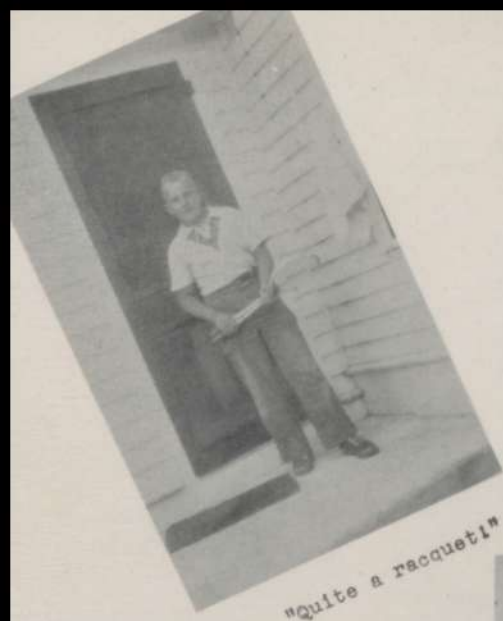
