
#### **DEDICATION**

Our class shall always try to exemplify their motto, "Nothing is impossible if no one cares who gets the credit."
















# The Class Prophecy


and Dale Seppa, Council representatives.

Elected as Cheerleaders were Sandy Boers - B team, Bengs - an alternate, and Bonnie Marshall - A team.




We sponsored a Halloween Dance on October 31, 1954.

The Freshmen entered a humorous play in the contest held on December 6, 1954. The title was "He Tried With His Boots On," and it won fourth place.


After the Laona game January 28, 1955, the Freshmen sponsored another dance.

in May.





