
As our final year comes to a close, we leave many precious memories behind and venture confidently into the world that we have spent all these years preparing for, ready to face life squarely and leave our mark on society.

"Frosh" started the year by putting long hours into the construction of the float. "Bye Bye Birdie" paid off when we took first place in the Homecoming parade.




Three Lakes marches on and on and on in the crisp fall air.
