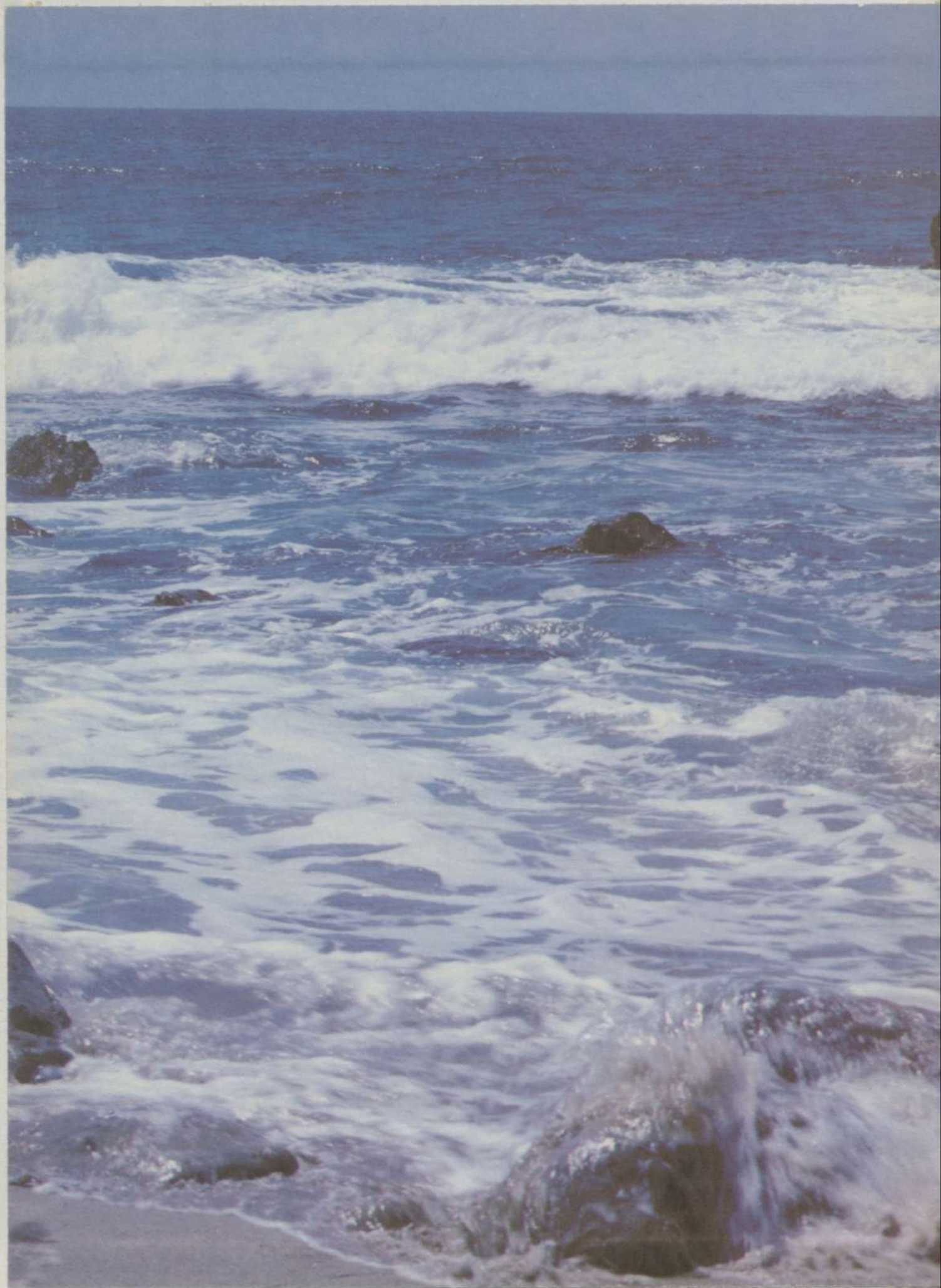
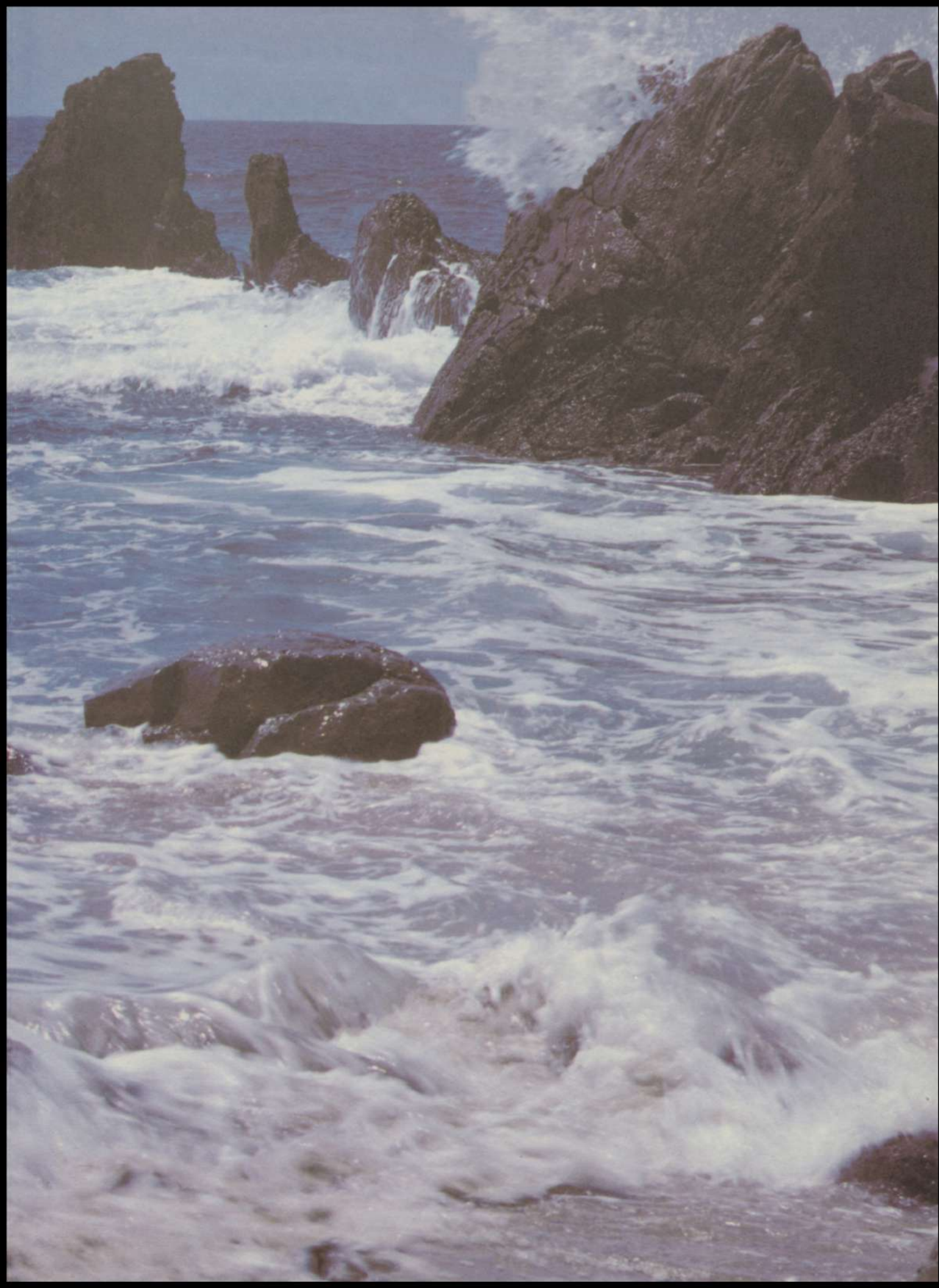


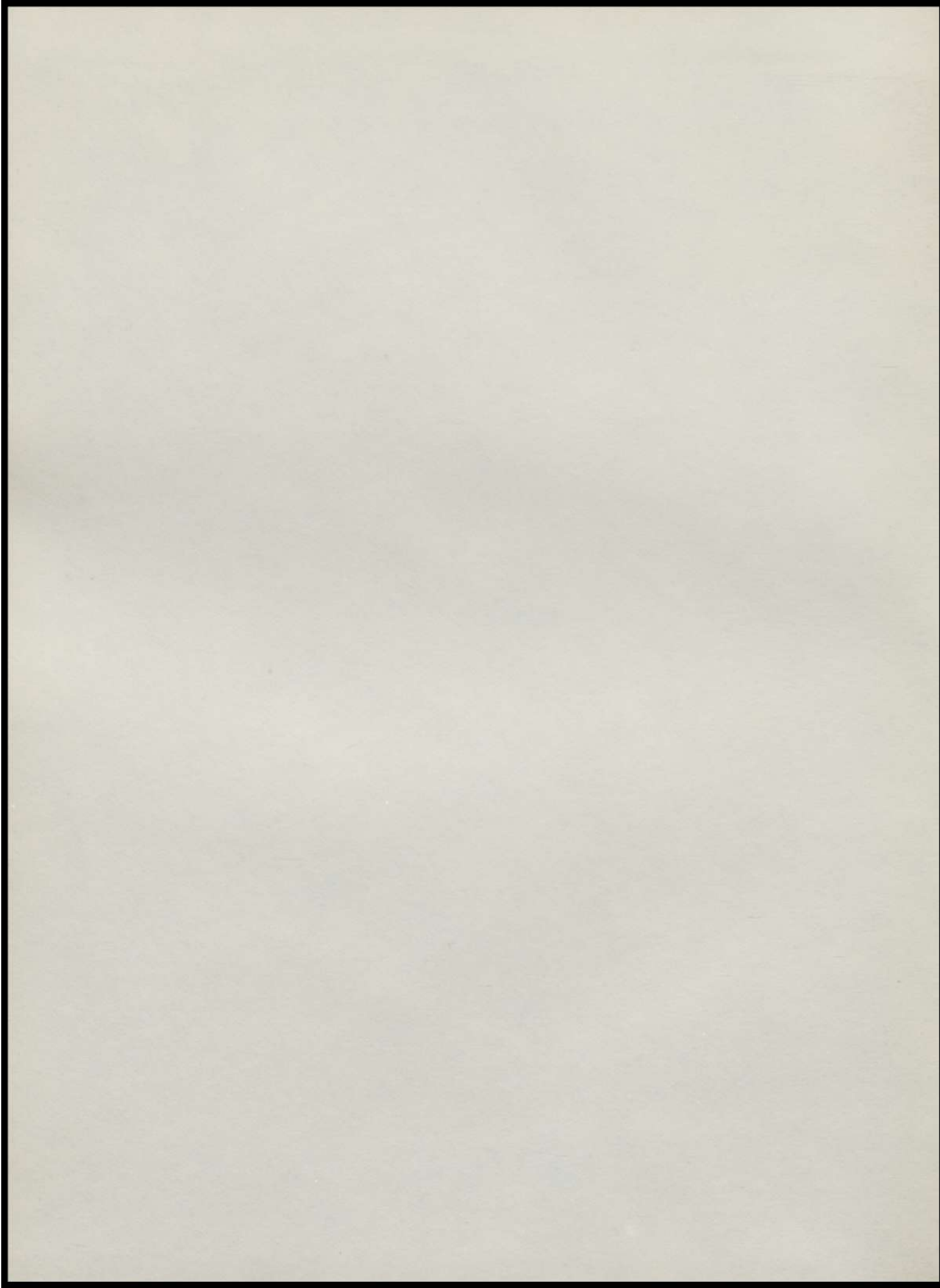

For all of her 10 years that she was here, she always seemed to know what was going on when no one else did, and so we dedicate our 1976-77 Yearbook to her.

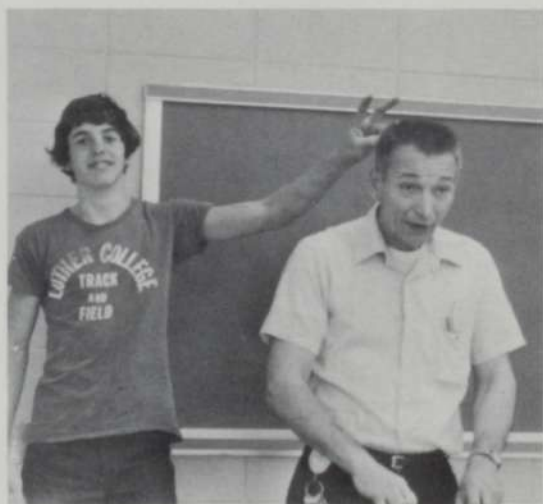
