June 18, 2024

ADMINISTRATION:

- The Library is taking part in the Great Lakes Great Read book club. The program invites the entire state to read two books (one for kids, one for adults) and then hosts a webinar at the end of the season to discuss it.
- The museum landscaping project is progressing and there will be construction beginning in the fall on the Johnson House. This has the potential to disrupt where the garbage bins are kept, but I'll be keeping up to date on construction and have some backup plans in place.
- Library landscaping electrical is complete and lighting is done. Make sure to check out the fountain and the beautiful evening lights!
- With our digital community continuing to grow, we're testing how they interact with the Beanstack app.
 We have several reading challenges loaded on it for further digital engagement and are working to cross market it with the Libby app.

COMMUNITY COLLBORATION:

- The Plant Swap saw donations from EverGood Farms and several members of the community participated in sharing and discussing all the available plants. The community was generous in donating to the library through this program both monetarily and through extra plants.
- The Memorial Day Weekend book sale is completed! It was a successful sale, bringing in more money than previous Memorial Day sales. Thank you to Karen for picking up the 4th of July book sale!
- Oneida County Veterans Service Office Hours will begin once a month in the Spruce Room on the 19th.
 The Veterans Services office seems very excited to have a partner in their community engagement.
- The town is exploring some economic development opportunities. Jill has offered some position as an educational arm of some of the plans and is working with the Visitors Center to determine the extent to which we can provide assistance.



Storybook Gardens creates adventure for visiting families

The Storybook Gardens in Three Lakes, established in 2021, is a community project created for families who would like to enjoy quality literature and have fun together.

Each of the twelve themed spaces contains a bench on which you can read engaging fiction and nonfiction books. In addition, a fun activity related to the books is provided. A map showing the locations of each space can be found in the library's brochure which you can get at the Three Lakes Area Visitors Bureau, Demmer Library, or at one of the sites.

Storybook Gardens of Three Lakes is generally open from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Books, and sometimes the activities, are changed every couple of years. This year, visitors can create their own adventures at the Demmer Library. While at the downtown Gathering Place, discover fun facts about seeds while enjoying a great Eric Carle book. Stop in at Mind Chimes to try your hand at writing some poetry! If you have visited Storybook Gardens in the past, come again to check out what's new!
